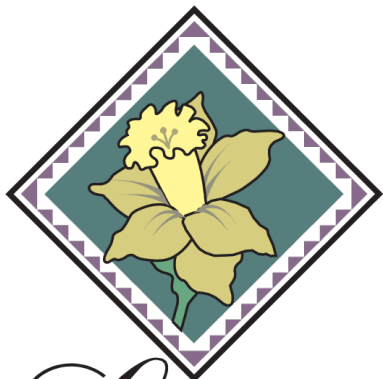

Everyone also had time to ask questions about the show. Parking issues were brought up. Guild members need to park in distant lots. If handicapped, tell someone when you enter the building and we will park your car for you in a distant lot and get it for you when you are ready to leave. This allows our paying attendees, that are handicapped, to park close. Help is needed Thurs. evening and Friday for set up and also Sunday evening. We need help to get vendors out of the building before we can start takedown. No quilts will be removed from the building until take down process is completed and quilts are sorted.

Great News for Quilters from Wisconsin State Fair!

#1 - We have updated our quilt competition rules and redefined the classes.

The changes recognize the skills of exhibitors quilting with stationary machines, versus movable machines, versus quilts finished by other people/services.

#2 – We have new Youth classes; “Me and My Mentor” and “All By Myself”.

We hope to encourage young people to become more involved with a sewing and quilting. Separating the youth classes into two groups allows us to reward our young exhibitors equitably.

#3 – Two Special Competitions – (Entry deadline is June 12, judging is June 20)

“Quilt-topia Barn Quilt” rules have been updated. The winner’s quilt block will be proudly reproduced as a sign on one of the buildings at the Wisconsin State Fair.

“Sowing Creativity – Harvesting Quilts” is new! We added a few extra guidelines to encourage creativity using surface design and embellishments.

#4 – There is a new quilt guild competition this year, based on the number of quilts entered and the number of youth being mentored by quilt guild members. Guild members earn ONE point for every quilt they entered and TWO points for every quilt entered by a mentored youth.
