Challenge Quilt

"A Yarn Runs Through It"

Each entrant will receive a length of yarn which needs to be incorporated into their quilt. The quilt may be any type that you choose – applique, landscape, a pattern that you currently have, etc.

The requirements are:

- The finished size needs to be 18" x 18"
- The yarn must enter on the left side of the quilt at any point and exit on the right side of the quilt at any point.
- Each quilt must have a 4 ¹/₂" hanging sleeve on the back.

Nov. 10, 2022 Meeting Minutes

- Pam brought the meeting to order at 6:45 and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. We had one guest.
- Tom Hoffman was our program and speaker. He collects and distributes quilts for veterans to our local nursing homes. He gave a short talk and described how he was treated as a returning Vietnam veteran. We donated about 18 guilts for him to distribute.

- Social was hosted by Ellen Buck, Kathy Guralski and Ann Zeman.
- Old Business
 - Marlene Denor made a motion to approve the Secretary's report, second was by Lynn Sweetman.
 - Pearl Stock made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report, second was by Eleanor Podner.
 - Betty Schwede discussed the proposed wool workshop by Tammy VanderBloomen. Based on results from last month's questionnaire, few members would be able to attend a workshop in May and it was suggested that we resume discussion of the workshop after Tammy does her program for our June meeting. She also asked members what they would like to learn/do for a workshop. Please contact Betty with any suggestions.
 - Quilt show Pam reminded us that the guild was formed in May of 1993.
 Our upcoming show will be just before our 30th anniversary. She is looking for previous show names and 1 or 2 props from those shows.
 - Member booklets are at the printer. Once they are finalized we will get them and the price will be determined.
- New Business
 - Quilt show registration forms were distributed to members, one each, you will need to make copies for additional quilts. If you are able, please email

your quilt descriptions to Mary Hutchison. Two new categories were added, Mystery Quilt (for the guild Mystery Quilt) and Quilts for Vets.



Spring Camp will be March 24-26, 2023 at Camp Tapawingo. Once again, we will not have an overnight stay. More information will be provided once it is closer.

- Fair Quilt Kathy Guralski gave a summary of the County Fair Quilt that the guild has been facilitating. In 2021, the Fair Board incorporated a "Woman's Day". As part of that we do a quilt block contest based on the theme for the current fair. Blocks are submitted by both members and the public, displayed at the fair and voted on. From there, the blocks are made into a quilt by guild members. The completed quilt is displayed around the area at places such as Discovery Wisconsin, Rummage-o-Rama, Breakfast on the Farm, etc. This provides great promotion for the guild.
- Last year's quilt raffle ticket sales brought in over \$600.
 Distribution of the net proceeds are determined by the guild.
 Last year's quilt proceeds will be donated to Camp Tapawingo and Ascend Services.
- Once the current year's quilt is completed, we will be looking for volunteers to take the quilt and sell raffle tickets at various events. Please consider taking some time out of your busy schedules to help with this worthwhile event. We are hoping to have 2-3 members at an event.
- The theme for next year's fair is "Pirates of the Carrots and Beans". The colors are orange, green and blue.



- The Christmas Social will be held at Ascend Services. We will be meeting at 6:00pm. A light meal will be provided. Please wear something festive. For show and tell, please bring a holiday textile instead of regular show and tell.
- Tax Exempt Status Our guild is designated as a 501(c)(4) organization, therefore, we don't qualify for the Wisconsin sales tax exemption.
 - Legal name for the guild is "A Patch of Lakeshore Quilters". Please use this name for things such as raffle tickets, etc.

QUILT ENTRY RULES AND GUIDELINES:

- □ A quilt must be quilted through 3 layers (top, batting, backing).
- □ Pieced, tied quilts are permitted. No whole cloth tied quilts.
- □ Each quilt/item needs a label attached to the lower left corner as you look at the back of the quilt/item. Labels should include your name and name of the quilt.
- □ Each item requires a 4" sleeve across the top of the quilt/item for hanging.
- □ Quilt has not been entered in any Patch of Lakeshore Quilters previous shows.
- Review the quilt show categories (outlined below) and make sure you are choosing the correct category. Fill out the registration form completely or it will be returned for you to complete. The check-in committee reserves the right to re-categorize any quilt that is registered in an incorrect category.
- □ Quilts must be clean and free of smoke, odor and pet hair. The check-in committee reserves the right to reject any entry that does not comply.
- Quilt check-in is Thursday April 13, 2023 at Manitowoc Expo Center.
 - □ Judged quilts must be turned in between 9am and 12noon
 - □ All Other Quilts can be turned in between 9am and 6pm
- □ **Quilt check-out** begins Sunday, April 16, 2023 *after* vendors are gone and everything is taken down and cleaned up; not before. Be sure you, or the person picking up your items, has the ticket to claim your quilt.

QUILT CATEGORY DESCRIPTIONS:

Applique: Hand or Machine. (Applique is easily recognized as the focal point of the quilt.) **Art**: entrants own design, produced by one person, with creative thought and without replicating the work of others. May be untraditional in construction and appearance.

Pictorial- Must illustrate a recognizable image such as wildlife, cityscapes, the human form or natural scenery. Could include fantasy if recognizable images. *Abstract* - Must be original forms and compositions, with emphasis on color, line and design. Features abstract, cutting edge and non-literal guilts.

Challenge: "A Yarn Runs Through It". Quilt may be any type such as applique, landscape, a pattern that you have etc. Finished size needs to be 18" X 18", the yarn must enter on the left side of the quilt at any point and exit on the right side of the quilt at any point. The binding should NOT end the yarn.

Embroidered: Hand or Machine. (Embroidery is easily the focal point of the quilt.) **Group**: Quilt top is put together by 2 or more people, may include block exchanges, Round Robins or multi-generational quilts. Include names of all participants.

Miscellaneous quilted item: purse, table runner, garment, wool mats, etc **Novice**: quilter entering a quilt in a(any) show for the first time.

Youth: 18 years and under

Quilts for Veterans: quilt made for a veteran, active or retired. Quilts for Veterans will be presented to selected veterans on Sunday, April 16.

Traditional pieced: Hand or Machine Piecing dominates over other techniques **2021-22 Guild Mystery Quilt:** "Field of Diamonds" quilt: alternating 16-patch and "X"
