
~ May 8 Guild Meeting Minutes ~

Camp Quilt

- Set up dates with Camp Tapawingo (currently rolling over the deposit)
- o Reserve table at Two Rivers Family Restaurant for Friday breakfast
- Contact local quilt shops for camp discounts
- Committee is responsible for camp menu That means ordering from the restaurant and picking up if need be and coordinating cooking with members once the menu has been decided
- Come up with a quick project

Small Glossary of Quilting Abbreviations

Width of Fabric (WOF) refers to the full width of the fabric, typically from selvage to selvage. Understanding the WOF is crucial for cutting fabric pieces accurately for your quilt.

Right Sides Together (RST) means placing the right sides of two pieces of fabric together before sewing. This is how you create seams that are hidden on the inside of your quilt.

Free-Motion Quilting (FMQ) is a technique where you move the fabric freely under the sewing machine's needle to create intricate and decorative quilt designs.

Half-Square Triangle (HST) is a popular quilting block made by sewing two triangles together, forming a square with a diagonal seam.

Unfinished Object (UFO) refers to a quilting project that you've started but haven't completed yet. Many quilters have a few UFOs hiding in their closets.

Work in Progress (WIP) is a project that is currently being worked on but isn't yet finished. WIPs can range from small quilt blocks to full-sized quilts.






SEWING INSTRUCTIONS

HST = HALF-SQUARE TRIANGLE


- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (6) A squares and (1) D - square.
- 2. Place (6) marked A squares with (6) B squares, right sides together. Sew a ¼" away from both sides of the drawn diagonal lines. Cut along the drawn diagonal line, making (12) HST units. Trim HST units to measure 3 ½" × 3 ½" unfinished.




3. Draw a diagonal line through opposite corners as the seam allowance, on the wrong side of (6) HST units. Place (6) marked HST units with (6) unmarked HST units with each A side facing a B side. Sew a ¼" away from both sides of the drawn diagonal lines. Cut along the drawn diagonal line, making (12) small hourglass units. Find the center at 1 1/2" and trim hourglass units to measure 3" × 3" unfinished.




- 4. Repeat steps 2 and 3 using (1) C – square and (1) D – square to make (2) large hourglass units total. Find the center at 2 3/4" and trim hourglass units to measure 5 1/2" × 5 1/2" unfinished. (You will only need one large hourglass unit for this
- 5. Arrange (2) small hourglass units as shown. Sew together units in a pair to make a short block border. Press in direction of arrow. The short border should measure 3" × 5 ½" unfinished. Repeat to make a second short block border.





6. Arrange (8) small hourglass units, (2) short block borders, and (1) large hourglass unit as shown. Sew the units together in rows and press. Then sew the rows together and press to complete Block 10. Block 10 should measure 10 ½" × 10 ½" unfinished.
