Quilts for the Quilt Show

Registration Forms are available on the website in the member's only area.

Be sure to get your forms in; the sooner the better for planning purposes.

H. (her email is on the form). This helps save time reading handwriting and formatting for the guilt description signs.

Remember that quilts need a **label** (with your name, and name of the quilt) and a **4 inch hanging sleeve** (www.youtube.com/watch?v=bF81VRK4ilw)

Challenge Quilt: "A Yarn Runs Through It"

Each entrant will receive a length of yarn which needs to be incorporated into their quilt. The quilt may be any type that you choose – applique, landscape, a pattern that you currently have, etc.

The requirements are:

- The finished size needs to be 18" x 18"
- The yarn must enter on the left side of the quilt at any point and exit on the right side of the quilt at any point.
- Each quilt must have a 4 ½" hanging sleeve on the back.

Set up and Show Schedule

Thursday, April 13th

- 10 am to 12 Noon Judged quilts* delivered. None after 12 noon. Judging starts at 1pm.
- 10 am to 6:30 pm Deliver quilts*.
 - *Have quilts folded with the label exposed.
- 10 am to 6:30 pm Deliver themed baskets and handmade items for sale in the charity booth. Items will also be accepted on Friday.
- 12 Noon to 6:45 pm Deliver gift boutique items.
- 6:45 pm Guild meeting at Expo Center
- ***Remaining raffle tickets and money MUST be returned to Sue DuPont before the show opens.***

Friday, April 14th

8 am to Finish – Quilt show set up. Everyone helps. If you can only help for a couple hours, please come; every little bit of help is needed.

Individual committees set up their areas.

- 9:00 am to 12 Noon Deliver gift boutique items.
- 9:00 am to 11:00 am Drop off Friday food donations.
- 12 Noon Take Tylenol as our feet will hurt.

Any ladder-climbing, able body persons are welcome at any time to hang lights and/or quilts.

Saturday, April 15th & Sunday April 16th - 9:00 am - 3:00 pm - Show Open!

Remember each guild member is asked to work two 3-hour shifts during the run of the show. If you still need to volunteer or have questions about when you work please call Ellen Lewellen.

The work schedule will be posted outside the kitchen during the show and at the Thursday Guild meeting.

- 3 pm Vendor pack up. PLQ members help as needed.
- 4 pm Everyone help take down quilts. After all quilts are down and display area is cleared and packed, quilts will be returned to their owners.
- 6 pm Home with our feet up and enjoying our favorite beverage.

General Show Reminders:

- Bring your quilts to the Expo center on Thursday April 13 starting at 10:00 am. Have all quilts folded with the label exposed.
- You will receive a claim check for each quilt. You will use those claim checks to pick up your quilt on Sunday.
- Pick up your quilts on Sunday after the show has been taken down and cleaned up. This could be anywhere from 5 to 6 pm; depending on how long it takes to get everything done.

Just a few reminders for members selling items in the Gift Boutique:

- Any handmade items are welcome.
- Each member is limited to a maximum of 12 items in any one category at any one time. Your extras may be placed in boxes/bins under the tables.
- If you can display your items in any type of container, please do so and put your name on the bottom of it.
- The Guild retains 10% of all sales.
- Please use the uniform inventory list (available on the website in the Member's area), number your items consecutively, attach a price tag, and price in full dollar or half-dollar amounts.
- We will accept donations of gently used gift bags and unused tissue paper.
- You or the person dropping off your items will be asked to sign a disclaimer. The drop-off times are as follows:

Thursday, April 13th from 12:00 Noon until our meeting. Friday, April 14th from 9:00 AM until 12:00 Noon

Mystery Quilt 2023

(Committee: Kathy Guralski, Ellen Buck, Ann Zeman, Joan Behnke)

We have another fun mystery quilt this year!

This particular pattern was created a number of years ago by a quilt designer and posted online as a free mystery quilt. The quilt will again give you an opportunity to use up some of your scrappy stash. Each month (February to June) you will receive a step. In June you will have the full pattern and hopefully by September we can all share what we have made. It will be fun to see how different each quilt can look with the various fabrics you choose. Below is more information and your first step for the month of February:

Fabric Requirements and Cutting Directions

Fabric Requirements

You can purchase your Jelly Roll

OR make your own from your stash.

Choose the size of quilt you want to make

Here are the number of strips (2.5" by 42/44") of fabric you will need.

Three sizes:

Larger Comfort Quilt - 78" by 78"

(40) 2.5" strips (Most Jelly Rolls have 40 strips) 3 1/8 yards background fabric

Comfort Quilt - 58" by 78"

(32) 2.5" strips

2 ½ yards background fabric

Lap Quilt or Baby Quilt - 58" by 58"

(23) 2.5" strips

1 3/4 yards background fabric



Cutting Directions

78" by 78" Larger Comfort Quilt

Jelly Roll Strips – (40) 2.5" by 42/44" strips (you may need (2) additional strips from your stash that blend with the Jelly Roll strips if your strips are less than 44". See directions below.)

CUT STRIPS INTO PIECES ACCORDING TO THE CHART BELOW:

Total pieces needed in each size

(72) 2.5" by 10.5" rectangles

(48) 2.5" by 6.5" rectangles

(248) 2.5" squares [To save on cutting and sewing you could cut (100) 2.5" squares and save the remaining strips. These strips will be used to strip sew blocks rather than sewing each 2.5" block together.]

Background Fabric

Cut background fabric into (44) 2.5" by 42/44" strips

Total pieces needed in each size

(75) 2.5" by 10.5" rectangles [If using one background fabric you can cut (25) 6.5" by 10.5" rectangles instead of the (75) 2.5" by 10.5".]

(50) 2.5" by 6.5" rectangles

(244) 2.5" squares [To save on cutting and sewing you could cut (96) 2.5" squares and save the remaining strips. These strips will be used to strip sew blocks rather than sewing each 2.5" block together.]

58" by 78" Comfort Quilt

Jelly Roll Strips – (32) 2.5" by 42/44" strips

CUT STRIPS INTO PIECES ACCORDING TO THE CHART BELOW:

Total pieces needed in each size:

(51) 2.5" by 10.5" rectangles

(34) 2.5" by 6.5" rectangles

(200) 2.5" squares [To save on cutting and sewing you could cut (72) 2.5" squares and save the remaining strips. These strips will be used to strip sew blocks rather than sewing each 2.5" block together.]

Background Fabric

Cut background fabric into (33) 2.5" by 42/44" strips

Total pieces needed in each size

(54) 2.5" by 10.5" rectangles [If using one background fabric you can cut (18) 6.5" by 10.5" rectangles instead of the (54) 2.5" by 10.5".]

(36) 2.5" by 6.5" rectangles

(196) 2.5" squares [To save on cutting and sewing you could cut (68) 2.5" squares and save the remaining strips. These strips will be used to strip sew blocks rather than sewing each 2.5" block together.]



58" by 58" Lap or Baby Quilt

Jelly Roll Strips - (23) 2.5" by 42/44" strips

CUT STRIPS INTO PIECES ACCORDING TO THE CHART BELOW:

Total pieces needed in each size:

(36) 2.5" by 10.5" rectangles

(24) 2.5" by 6.5" rectangles

(160) 2.5" squares [To save on cutting and sewing you could cut (52) 2.5" squares and save the remaining strips. These strips will be used to strip sew blocks rather than sewing each 2.5" block together.]

Background Fabric

(24) 2.5" by 42/44" strips

Total pieces needed in each size

(39) 2.5" by 10.5" rectangles [If using one background fabric you can cut (13) 6.5" by 10.5" rectangles instead of the (39) 2.5" by 10.5".]

(26) 2.5" by 6.5" rectangles

(156) 2.5" squares [To save on cutting and sewing you could cut (48) 2.5" squares and save the remaining strips. These strips will be used to strip sew blocks rather than sewing each 2.5" block together.]





Spring Quilt Camp

- Dates: March 24, 25, 26 (daytime only, no overnights)
- Location: Camp Tapawingo, 915 W. Tapawingo Road, Mishicot
- Three days of sewing/quilting/preparing for projects that you bring/sharing ideas/conversations/eating with fellow quilters. Bring your projects, sewing machine and whatever you need to work on your projects.
- Irons (water)/ironing boards/cutting tables/mats provided.
- Breakfast: Friday, March 24, 2023 meet at 8:00 am Two Rivers Family Restaurant, 3015 Tannery Road, Two Rivers. Anyone wanting to join us before we go out to camp, you are responsible to pay for your own meal. If you are not meeting for breakfast, camp will open approx. 9:20am.
- **Registration**: open to members only until March 13th. If camp is not filled by then, registration will be open to non-members.
 - o Registration form on page 10 of this newsletter.
 - o Cancellations: accepted until March 14.
- Fees: Are due at time of registration with checks made out to PLQ.
 - PLQ member- \$55.00 for the three days of camp.
 - Non-member- \$75.00 (if any opening) for three days of camp.
- Door prizes: Anyone at camp who wishes to participate in "BOGO" drawing brings a wrapped (\$10.00) gift. Be sure to place your name inside the gift so the person receiving knows you to thank. Put your name on paper and place in drawing container. Drawings occurs throughout the weekend.

Meals:

- Friday lunch on your own. Supper pizza provided.
- Saturday- two meals provided, brunch and supper.
- Sunday- brunch provided.
- Beverages provided are milk/coffee/ OJ/water. Any other beverages BYOB.
 There is an ice machine at camp.
- There is a sharing table for snacks; bring whatever you choose. You are asked to take any leftovers home with you if there are any.

***If you usually eat breakfast, on Saturday and Sunday you can eat off the sharing table or bring what you want to eat.
