Please bring your committee folder along with any comments or suggestions from the quilt show. If unable to make it, please get your folder to Kathy or I as soon as possible.



English Paper Piecing Workshop

What is English Paper Piecing and How is it Different from Regular Paper Piecing?

English Paper Piecing is primarily hand sewing. It uses a technique of wrapping fabric scraps around a precut stiff piece of paper, then sewing those fabric wrapped paper



pieces together. Regular paper piecing or Foundation paper piecing uses a larger piece of paper with the pattern printed on it, usually with each piece to be added in a numbered order on the reverse side of the pattern. One thing both techniques have in common is removing the papers before adding a backing and quilting the piece.

Why would you want to learn this technique? It's fun! It can use scraps from your stash! It's portable....handwork easily brought along while you're waiting at the doctor's office, on a car trip, at your in-laws.....! C'mon, this is something you know you always wanted to try! And it's pretty easy...you can teach it to your 8 year old.

We will be starting out with one of the easiest shapes to master...the hexagon, although other shapes will be demonstrated. If you'd like to try your hand at fussy cutting, choose one of your fabrics with a repeating motif and plan on using more fabric. Other than the paper pieces themselves, which I will provide, the supplies you need to bring are simple.

Supplies List

- 3 different pieces of fabric, pressed. Approx 4", then 1/8 yd and 1/4 yd.
- Sharp fabric shears and hand sewing scissors or snips
- A thin needle and thread to blend with your fabric, 50 weight thread preferred but not a deal breaker
- Thimble if you use one
- Optional: small cutting mat or rotary mat with cutter. I use my shears myself, but I'll show you this method if you prefer
- 1 light, 1 dark marking pencil or pen depending on your fabric
- 2 or 3 binding clips, optional
- 1 gal zipper top bag to keep everything in






SEWING INSTRUCTIONS

HST = HALF-SQUARE TRIANGLE, SNF = STITCH AND FLIP

- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (4) D squares and (12) H – squares.
- 2. Arrange (1) A rectangle, (1) B square, and (1) E square as shown. Sew squares together. Press in direction of arrow. Then add rectangle to left-hand edge to form a corner unit and press. The corner unit should measure 3 ½" × 3 ½" unfinished. Repeat to make four total corner units.
- 3. Place (4) H squares onto top left corners of (4) corner units, right sides together. Sew along the drawn diagonal lines. Trim excess corner fabric to ¼". Press toward the SNF corners.




4. Place (2) D – squares with (2) G – squares, right sides together. Sew a ¼" away from both sides of the drawn diagonal lines. Cut along the drawn diagonal line, making (4) D/G HST units. Trim HST units to measure 2 ½" × 2 ½" unfinished.




5. Repeat HST unit assembly to make (4) D/F HST units.






Repeat to make four total side units.



8. Arrange (4) corner units, (4) side units, and (1) I – square as shown. Sew the pieces together in rows and press. Then sew the rows together and press to complete Block 8. Block 8 should measure 10 ½" × 10 ½" unfinished.
