From the President's Desk

I came across an article recently which explained the Zeigarnick Effect (named after the female social psychologist who described it). It states that unfinished tasks loom larger in our minds than finished ones. In other words, when we finish a task, we mentally cross it off, but unfinished ones hang heavy in our minds. Of course I immediately thought of quilting applications such as UFOs, guilt over unused fabric purchases for planned but never made quilts and the like. A little kick in the pants is good to motivate us sometimes, but if you have projects or tasks which are weighing on you, here are some suggestions from Ms. Zeigarnick and me.

- **1.** Develop systematic ways to track progress. This could be keeping a list, checking off the steps of a pattern, journaling, or stacking up those finished quilts or jars of jam (whatever!) and admiring them.
- **2.** Create intentional closure points for ongoing projects such as those listed in #1 or simply setting a timer for so many minutes of work on your project.
- **3.** Practice purposeful mind closing. In other words, at the end of each day instead of worrying about what there is yet to do, review in your mind all that you did accomplish that day and mentally pat yourself on the back. Many quilters keep scrapbooks or photo journals of completed quilts.





2 1/2" TRIM-IT RULER 10 1/2" TRIM-IT RULER SUE DALEY DESIGNS ROTATING CUTTING MAT

SEWING INSTRUCTIONS

HST = HALF-SQUARE TRIANGLE, SNF = STITCH AND FLIP


- Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (6) A squares, (16) B - squares, (2) D - squares, and (20) F - squares.
- 2. Place (6) A squares with (6) C squares, right sides together. Sew a 1/4" away from both sides of the drawn diagonal lines. Cut along the drawn diagonal lines, making (12) A/C HST units. Trim HST units to measure 2 1/2" × 2 1/2" unfinished.



3. Repeat HST unit assembly to make (4) D/E HST units.




 Place (2) B – squares onto opposite corners of (4) G - squares, right sides together. Sew along the drawn diagonal lines. Trim excess corner fabric to a ¼". Press toward the corners. Repeat on remaining corners to make (4) B/G SNF units. The B/G SNF units should measure 2 1/2" × 2 1/2" unfinished.



Repeat SNF unit assembly to make (5) F/G SNF units.



6. Arrange (12) A/C HTS units, (4) D/E HTS units, (4) B/G SNF units, and (5) F/G SNF units as shown. Sew the units together in rows. Press in direction of arrows. Then sew the rows together and press to complete Block 11. Block 11 should measure 10 ½" × 10 ½" unfinished.

SEWING INSTRUCTIONS

SNF = STITCH AND FLIP

- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (4) A squares, (8) B - squares, (8) E - squares, and (8) F - squares.
- 2. Place (4) B squares onto opposite corners of (2) D – squares, right sides together. Sew along the drawn diagonal lines. Trim excess corner fabric to ¼". Press toward the corners. Place (2) marked A – squares onto top left corners of same D - squares to make (2) D block corners measuring 4 1/4" × 4 1/4" unfinished.
- 3. Repeat Step 2 to make (2) G block corners measuring 4 1/4" × 4 1/4" unfinished.










- 4. Place (2) E squares onto bottom left corners of (2) unmarked A – squares, right sides together. Sew along the drawn diagonal lines. Trim excess corner fabric to 1/4". Press toward the corners. Place (2) F – squares onto bottom right corners of same A – squares to make (2) E/F SNF units measuring 3" × 3" unfinished.
- 5. Repeat Step 4 to make (2) F/E SNF units measuring 3" × 3" unfinished.





CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS Fabric 1:


- A (8) 3" squares
- B − (8) 1 ¾" squares
- $C (4) 1 \frac{3}{4}$ " × 3" rectangles

Fabric 2:

- D (2) 4 ¼" squares
- E − (8) 1 ¾" squares


Fabric 3:

- F − (8) 1 ¾" squares
- G (2) 4 ¼" squares




Fabric 4:


- H − (1) 3" square
- 6. Place (2) E squares onto bottom left corners of (2) C – rectangles, right sides together. Sew along the drawn diagonal lines. Trim excess corner fabric to ¼". Press toward the corners. Place (2) F – squares onto bottom right corners of same C - rectangles to make (2) E/F Flying Geese units measuring 1 3/4" × 3" unfinished.
- 7. Repeat Step 6 to make (2) F/E Flying Geese units measuring $1 \frac{3}{4}$ " × 3" unfinished.



8. Arrange (4) SNF units and (4) Flying Geese units as shown. Sew the units together in pairs. Press in direction of arrows to make block sides. The block sides should measure 3" x 4 1/4" unfinished.



9. Arrange (4) block corners, (4) block sides, and (1) H – square as shown. Sew the pieces together in rows and press. Then sew the rows together and press to complete Block 12. Block 12 should measure 10 ½" × 10 ½" unfinished.
