Challenge Quilt

"A Yarn Runs Through It"

Each entrant will receive a length of yarn which needs to be incorporated into their quilt. The quilt may be any type that you choose – applique, landscape, a pattern that you currently have, etc.

The requirements are:

- The finished size needs to be 18" x 18"
- The yarn must enter on the left side of the quilt at any point and exit on the right side of the quilt at any point.
- Each quilt must have a 4 ½" hanging sleeve on the back.

Oct. 6th Quilt Show Committee Discussion

Items that were discussed:

- All members can put quilts in the show even if they are not going to be available for the show; suggest that they work on pre-quilt items. We need hearts made, props etc. Please contact chairs to let us know what you can work on.
- Tied Quilts – Previously, we did accept tied quilts. But it has been brought to our attention that a few members are tying pieced quilts as that is how their family likes them. Pieced and tied quilts accepted. No whole cloth tied quilts.
- Quilt drop off will be 9-6 on Thursday, and those being judged must be dropped off by noon.
- We will have trifolds made for the show. They will be placed at the entrance and in the history booth.
- Food will be provided for the crew on Thursday and Friday. This will include any spouses that would be so gracious to help.
- We will be making hearts for props and for the public. We will make hearts and put a tag on them telling them this is a lost heart please take me home. Those will also have a tag about the quilt show on it. The ones for the public will be larger and will be decorated. A large container of buttons has been donated.
- An email will go out a few days after the quilt show meeting. This email will let you know what has been discussed.

QUILT ENTRY RULES AND GUIDELINES:

- A quilt must be quilted through 3 layers (top, batting, backing).
- Pieced, tied quilts are permitted. No whole cloth tied quilts.
- Each quilt/item needs a label attached to the lower left corner as you look at the back of the quilt/item. Labels should include your name and name of the quilt.
- Each item requires a 4" sleeve across the top of the quilt/item for hanging.
- Quilt has not been entered in any Patch of Lakeshore Quilters previous shows.
- Review the quilt show categories (outlined below) and make sure you are choosing the correct category. Fill out the registration form completely or it will be returned for you to complete. The check-in committee reserves the right to re-categorize any quilt that is registered in an incorrect category.
- Quilts must be clean and free of smoke, odor and pet hair. The check-in committee reserves the right to reject any entry that does not comply.
- Quilt check-in** is Thursday April 13, 2023 at Manitowoc Expo Center.
 - Judged quilts** must be turned in between 9am and 12noon
 - All Other Quilts** can be turned in between 9am and 6pm
- Quilt check-out** begins Sunday, April 16, 2023 *after* vendors are gone and everything is taken down and cleaned up; not before. Be sure you, or the person picking up your items, has the ticket to claim your quilt.

QUILT CATEGORY DESCRIPTIONS:

Applique: Hand or Machine. (Applique is easily recognized as the focal point of the quilt.)

Art: entrants own design, produced by one person, with creative thought and without replicating the work of others. May be untraditional in construction and appearance.

Pictorial- Must illustrate a recognizable image such as wildlife, cityscapes, the human form or natural scenery. Could include fantasy if recognizable images.

Abstract - Must be original forms and compositions, with emphasis on color, line and design. Features abstract, cutting edge and non-literal quilts.

Challenge: "A Yarn Runs Through It". Quilt may be any type such as applique, landscape, a pattern that you have etc. Finished size needs to be 18" X 18", the yarn must enter on the left side of the quilt at any point and exit on the right side of the quilt at any point. The binding should NOT end the yarn.

Embroidered: Hand or Machine. (Embroidery is easily the focal point of the quilt.)

Group: Quilt top is put together by 2 or more people, may include block exchanges, Round Robins or multi-generational quilts. Include names of all participants.

Miscellaneous quilted item: purse, table runner, garment, wool mats, etc

Novice: quilter entering a quilt in a(any) show for the first time.

Youth: 18 years and under

Quilts for Veterans: quilt made for a veteran, active or retired. Quilts for Veterans will be presented to selected veterans on Sunday, April 16.

Traditional pieced: Hand or Machine Piecing dominates over other techniques
