??? Mystery Quilt 2022 ???

(Committee members: Kathy Guralski, Linda Londo, Ellen Buck, Ann Zeman)

This year's mystery quilt will include steps to creating an easy scrap quilt designed with a combination of two traditional quilt blocks and a patchwork border. There are several variations of the quilt layout, giving it a complicated look at first glance, but is quite simple to construct. You will be given some different options. Each month (February to June) you will receive a step. In June you will have the full pattern and hopefully by September we can all share what we have made. It will be fun to see how different each quilt can look with the various fabrics you choose.

Size / Finished Measurements

Block Size: 8-1/2 x 8-1/2 inches

Finished Quilt: 56 x 72 inches

Increase its size by adding another border to the quilt or by sewing additional quilt blocks.

STEP 4 (May):


If you have not yet completed and assembled the x blocks and sixteen patch blocks this would be a good month to catch up. Step 4 for the month of May cannot be completed until your blocks have all been sewn and assembled. You still have May and June to catch up. You even have time to get started \odot

1) Cut Squares for Borders


When cutting the colorful squares, try to get as big a variety as possible for a truly "scrappy" effect unless you are trying to match up certain colors for a design.

- 68 4-1/2 x 4-1/2 inch background squares
 Tip: You could work with rectangles to create the border. It has less seams. If you choose rectangles cut 32 rectangles at 4-1/2 x 8-1/2 and 4 squares 4-1/2 x 4-1/2.
- 64 2-1/2 inch x 2-1/2 inch colorful squares

2) Make the Border Squares Each patchwork square on the border will have a colorful triangle in one of its corners. The same quick-piecing technique used for the corners of the X block is used to do so here.



 Draw a diagonal line on the reverse side of each of the smaller squares, just as when making the X blocks.



• On each of the 64 larger squares sew one small square to one corner. Set the seams, trim, and press the triangle open to the right side.

Set aside, along with the four remaining larger squares.

• **Tip:** If working with rectangles to create the border, on 28 of the rectangles sew one small square to both corners on a long side of the rectangle. For the remaining 4 rectangles sew one small square to just one corner on the long side of the rectangle. Also sew a small square to the 4 squares as shown above.

3) Make Borders

Lay out two sets of eighteen 4-1/2 inch patchwork border squares in pairs of blocks, colorful corners abutting, plain sides end to end.

Tip: If working with rectangles lay out two sets of 8 border rectangles and two border square blocks with colorful corners abutting.


- When you are sure of your sequence, seam each long border row. Press seams between border squares to best match the quilt.
- Sew each long border to the quilt, matching and pinning endpoints and midpoints first, then matching and pinning remaining areas. Press seam allowances either direction.

Lay out two sets of fourteen 4-1/2 inch patchwork border squares in pairs of blocks, colorful corners abutting, plain sides end to end.

Tip: *If working with rectangles lay out two sets of 8 border rectangles colorful corners abutting. The 4 rectangles with just one colorful corner will be on the ends.*

When you are sure of your sequence, seam each short border row. Press seams between border squares to best match the quilt.

- Sew a plain 4-1/2 inch background square on the ends of each short border. (unless using rectangles)
- Press as before and sew to the remaining short sides of the quilt.
