 - The night was closed out with a fun “Left - Right” story to distribute door prizes for all


Counted Cross Stitch Workshop - Jan 31, 2026

Art Quilt Workshop - April 11, 2026


Barbara from Wyverns Trove located in Columbus, WI will be leading an **Impressionist Art Quilt Workshop** for our guild. There will be kits with inspiration pictures and fabrics to get you started. Kit themes include: landscapes, pets, window scenes, flower bouquets, wreaths, and the like. All kits are different and Barbara plans to bring extras so there will be plenty of variety.

What you need to do before this workshop:

- Sign up using the form on the next page. Total cost is dependent on the quilt size you choose, listed below. Turn in form at the January meeting. Contact Karel H if you will not be at the Jan meeting.
- Decide your quilt size (larger quilts are easier to create an image)
 - 20"x30" - \$15
 - 24"x36" - \$20
 - 30"x40" - \$30
- Save novelty fabrics to use in your quilt and share/swap with others. Leaves, flowers, fur, animals, insects, bricks, rocks, trees, sky, clouds, grass and the like.

What you need to bring to the workshop:

- Sewing Machine
- Neutral Thread - blues, greens, or browns all work as a middle neutral
- Rotary Cutter and cutting mat
- Scissors
- The novelty fabrics you've been saving
- Highlighter and pencil
- Straight pins
- Lots of scrap paper for labeling



Helpful skills include knowing how to make: 4 patch, 16 patch, snow ball corners, and half square triangles from two pieces of fabric the same size as the finished square. (4 and 16 Patch instructions in Dec. 2025 newsletter. Snowball and half square triangles on)

Snowballs & Specialty Half Square Triangles

(esp. in prep for the Art Quilt Workshop)

Snowball Block


Block featuring triangles sewn onto the corners of a square, creating a rounded or octagonal "snowball" effect.

~You need 1 larger square of fabric and 4 contrasting smaller squares.



Construction:

- Start with one square of fabric the size of your desired unfinished block.
- Mark a diagonal line on the smaller squares and pin them to the corners of the larger square, fabrics right side together.
- Sew all four smaller pieces on the diagonal line
- Trim corners a quarter inch from seam.
- Flip corners and press




Sew diagonally from corner to corner across the small squares.

Trim corners 1/4" away from the stitching. I save trimmed triangles to use later.

Press corners open to complete snowball block.



Snow ball corners are often based on a 3rds or 4ths of the larger block, but can be wonky or different sizes, especially for an impressionistic art quilt.



Specialty Half Square Triangle (HST)

How to make one 2.5 inch HST from two 2.5 inch squares of fabric (size can be adjusted to what you need)

- Place fabric pieces right sides together.
- Mark and sew a diagonal seam, corner to corner (solid line=sew line)
- Trim 1/4" away from the seam and discard the trimmed piece (or save and sew a secondary, smaller HST) (dashed line=cut line)
- Press open


ADDITIONAL TOOLS NEEDED:

BASIC SEWING SUPPLIES
BACKING: 1 3/4 YARDS WIDEBACK BACKING
62" x 62" PIECE OF BATTING


FINAL QUILT ASSEMBLY

SNF = STITCH AND FLIP

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (260) C – squares.
2. Place (2) C – squares onto opposite corners of (1) D – square, right sides together. Sew along the drawn diagonal lines. Trim excess corner fabric to a 1/4". Press toward the corners. Repeat on remaining corners to make (1) SNF unit. The SNF units should measure 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" unfinished. Repeat to make (65) SNF units.



3. Arrange (2) B – rectangles and (1) SNF unit as shown. Sew the units together in a row. Press in direction of arrows to complete sashing unit. The unit should measure 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" unfinished. Repeat to make (20) sashing units.



4. Arrange remaining SNF units, remaining B – rectangles, sashing units, and Blocks 1-16 as shown. Sew the pieces together in rows and press toward B – rectangles and sashing units. Then sew the rows together and press seams open to complete the quilt center. The quilt center should measure 50 1/2" x 50 1/2" unfinished.
5. Sew A outer border strips together end-to-end. Cut two strips 54 1/2" long and two strips 50 1/2" long. Sew (2) 2 1/2" x 50 1/2" strips to side edges of quilt center and press seams toward outer border strips. Add 2 1/2" x 54 1/2" strips to top and bottom edges and press seams to finish quilt. Your quilt top should measure 54 1/2" x 54 1/2".

FINISHING THE QUILT

Finish quilt by layering the quilt top, batting, and backing. Baste quilt layers together and quilt as desired. Bind with binding strips.



CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

Fabric 1:

- Cut (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for outer borders (A)
- Cut (9) 2 1/2" x WOF strips; subcut:
(80) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles (B)
- Cut (10) 1 1/2" x WOF strips; subcut:
(260) 1 1/2" squares (C)

Fabric 2:

- Cut (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for binding
- Cut (5) 2 1/2" x WOF strips; subcut:
(65) 2 1/2" squares (D)



*Due to the hand-crafted nature of batiks, fabric may vary from images.
