Anyone wanting to join us before going out to camp; you are responsible to pay for your own meal.

If you are not meeting for breakfast, camp will open at approx. 9:20 am.

Registration: is open to members only, until September 9, 2021.

If camp is not filled by then registration will be open to non-members on September 10, 2021.
